



The Kindergarten Starters students, staff and parents are all set to build a sustainable future with more than 300 teachers and 40 parents being accredited as United Nations Climate Change Teachers.

As a sustainable community we pledge to plant 15000 trees before March 2020, under the 'Each One Plant One' community reach out and greening project. The greening has already begun with our parents and students planting trees outside the KGS premises during the summer break. This will be followed by several greening projects at the DULSCO Labour camps and the Al-Dhaid farms and many more.



The Kindergarten Starters has partnered with DULSCO in effective waste management. Students and staff at Kindergarten Starters have been oriented on reducing waste and segregating wet and dry waste. The wet waste generated will be composted in a compost machine and used as organic manure for the plants within and around the campus. All the water taps in the washrooms have been fitted with aerators which will eventually reduce water consumption by 75%. Apart from these climate change actions we will continue to say NO to plastic and recycle newspapers, cans, cardboard and electronic waste.

What's more exciting is that our students will be making deeper connections to Climate Change in their lessons than ever before so that we build climate change champions who are well-equipped to adapt to and mitigate Climate Change. When staff, parents and students act on climate change we can be sure of leaving behind a more sustainable future for the generations to come.
